Infinential Banking Firm of Kuhn. Loeb & Co. Declares That Unless Currency System is Imthe Country Will Have Panic and Speculation proved Record Frows Timid.

New York, Jan. 4.-Jacob H. Schiff, head of the influential banking find of Kuhn, Loeb & Co., sent a tremor through the speculative fabric of the stock market to day by his utterance of the opinion that unless something was done to im-prove the currency system of this country, there would be a panic compared with prove the currency system of this country, there would be a panic compared with which all panics which have gone before would seem as child's play. 

New 4.-Basing my figures upon returns from represen-tative gins throughout the cotton belt, I estimate that there had been ginned up to the evening of Decem-ber 31, 1905, out of this year's cotton prop 9,7.41,000 bales, which is estimated to be 90 per cent. of the crop and indicates a total gimning for the season of 10,828,000 bales. This estimate of the quantity ginned, it may be remarked, agreess exactly with Miss Giles' report of to-day, in which it is stated that 90 per cent. of the crop had been ginned and 96 per cent. picked, up to the 1st of January.
