YOUNG MAN KILLS HIS LIFE. Enfeebled by an illness with fever and depressed after the indulgence in a periodical spree, Leon H. Weathers, a resident of Raleigh and a capable young business man, committed suicide today at the residence of his mother, Mrs. C. H. Weathers, on South Blount street.

"Section 1. That an ordinance be introduced an ordinance prohibiting stock yards within the city limits adopted at the March meeting, 1906, be and the same is hereby repealed.

"Section 2. That the ordinance be in effect on and after its adoption."

Mr. Ward moved that this ordinance be adopted and his motion was seconded. As the rules were about to be suspended, Dr. Faison arose and objected. Not only did he object but he offered as an amendment to Mr. Whitaker that the ordinance be postponed until next Monday night. A called session would be held to discuss the matter in full. Dr. Faison declined in making his motion, that a debate action should be taken until the next meeting of the board of aldermen of the city of Charlotte.

STOCK YARDS AN ISSUE

What Was Believed to be Settled, a Problem Now Comes Before the Board. Mr. Dowd Asks a Question, but Receives No Reply—Final Action Postponed Until Next Monday Night—New Milk Ordinance Passed—More Light New Always Square—Like Banquo's ghost in Macbeth, the stock yard question "will not down."

At the last monthly meeting of the board of aldermen, an ordinance was passed which declared that after April 1 no stock yard or barn would be allowed within the city limits. It was believed that this ordinance settled the question for good and all.

But not so. At the regular meeting of the board of aldermen, which was held in the city hall last night, this was the first topic broached. Messrs. J. I. Blakely and J. H. Wearn, members of the board, and health commission, appeared in behalf of Mr. Whitaker, asking that the prohibitory stock yard ordinance of the last meeting be rescinded. They declared that they had visited Mr. Whitaker's plant and found it perfectly sanitary.

According to the statutes of North Carolina, no election on the liquor question, which in the case of Charlotte, was July 5th, 1906. Neither can the election be held within 30 days from the date of any State or county or municipal election. There will be a county election in Mecklenburg Nov. 5th. Therefore, if the liquor election is held this year it must be held before July 5th and before August 5th. The petition being circulated follows:
