PAVING IS DEFECTIVE. Greensboro Aldermen, on Strength of Report of Committee and Expert Engineer, Will Hold Up Payments On Street Paving Contracts. Special to The Observer.

Greensboro, May 11.—The special committee of the board of aldermen made its report at the regular meeting this afternoon in the matter of the investigation of the paving of Elm street with vitrified brick, the report stating that the paving is defective and does not comply with the contract and specifications and recommending that no further sums be paid by the city to the contractor, the Southern Paving & Construction Co., of Chattanooga, Tenn., until said contract and specifications are amended in substantial compliance with said contract and specifications.

The report is accompanied by a report of the expert engineer, G. C. White, of Durham, who was employed by the committee and assisted in investigating the paving work, by digging into it and examining it. The engineer's report is a lengthy document explaining the conditions found in the 15 excavations made, showing that the concrete foundation varied from the specifications of the contract, which provides for Portland cement concrete, one two, five volumes of cement, sand and stone and that some of the brick are not number one. The committee is composed of Mayor T. J. Murphy and Aldermen M. W. Thompson and D. C. Wyson. On motion of Alderman Hunter the report was adopted and the committee continued. Thus the matter stands and speculation is rife as to the final outcome of the controversy.

The board of aldermen created a fire commission to be composed of Aldermen L. J. Brandt, Chief F. N. Taylor, of the fire department, and A. W. McAllister, an insurance man.

STUCK BY LIGHTNING. Anderson Power Co.'s Plant Damaged to Extent of Several Thousand Dollars and Number of Mills Temporarily Deprived of Power. Special to The Observer.

Greenville, S. C., May 11.—The electric power plant of the Anderson Water, Light & Power Co., located at Portman, eight miles from Anderson, S. C., was seriously damaged by fire early this morning, resulting from a bolt of lightning. The transformer house was completely destroyed and the coils of the dynamo in the main building were burned. It will be impossible to estimate the money loss until electrical experts can make a minute examination, but it is believed that the actual loss will not exceed \$10,000.

Anderson is receiving her street and incandescent lights to-night from the Orr Mill's plant and nearly all the cotton factories and other industrial plants, which have been operated by the main power house, have been forced to resort to auxiliary steam power wherever possible until other arrangements can be made. It is said only one small cotton factory, the Townsend Mill, will be forced to shut down on account of inability to get power, but the operatives will be employed in the other mills. Three years ago the same company lost its entire plant on the Seneca river through the destruction of a dam, which caused a loss of \$150,000.

A SIXTY-ROOM DORMITORY.

It is to be erected at Weaverville College during the summer—Close of Successful Year. Correspondence of The Observer.

Asheville, May 10.—The commencement exercises of Weaverville College, the institution of learning in northern Buncombe under the control of the Western North Carolina Methodist Conference, ended this week in a highly successful manner.

The past year at Weaverville has been marked by much growth in interest and attendance. At the annual meeting of the board of trustees it was decided to build a 60-room dormitory to be ready for occupancy with the opening of the college next fall. Plans for the new building were accepted and the site for the new structure selected.

The contractors for the building will probably be let in a few days. It is the purpose of the trustees to have the dormitory constructed of hand-made brick, from clay near the property.

PROBABLY KILLED IN FIGHT.

Police Authorities of Washington, N. C. Discover a Box of Negro Floating in Pamlico River. Special to The Observer.

Washington, N. C., May 11.—Chief of Police George Howard and Policeman Whitley discovered the dead body of a negro floating in Pamlico river back of Sayors' cotton gin today about 1:30 o'clock. The negro was from Hyde county. His name is not known. He appears to be about 40 years old. Poul play is suspected as a fight occurred at that place a few nights ago and the police had reason to believe that the negro was in the river. It is reported that warrants have been issued for the guilty parties, but the coroner held an inquest over the body this evening at the city hall but the result has not been given out.
