FOREIGN NEWS NOTES.

Canada Reduces Duty of Oils Fifty Per Cent.—Railway Building at Cienfuegos.

The revenues of Canada for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1906, are estimated at \$79,000,000 by Finance Minister Fielding, according to a report received from Consul General John C. Foster by the bureau of manufactures.

At the present consumption Germany will double her tonnage for want of coal for 1906 years at least, or, allowing for increased demand, not until the year of grace 3,000.
