BOMBS IN HOUSE AT SEATTLE

Evidence of Rosenberg's Murderous Designs Which Pacific Coast Police Obtain
New York, July 6.—A dispatch from Seattle, Wash., on July 5, reported that the police of that city, acting at the instance of the German police, had raided the house formerly occupied by August Rosenberg, a bricklayer, and had found a plant for making bombs and infernal machines. Rosenberg left Seattle for Hamburg, Germany, on May 1. At that time the German government received a warning from Seattle that an attempt would be made to assassinate the German Emperor.

ABDUCTED ASHEVILLE GIRL

George Shaver, of Spartanburg, Who Eloped With Pearl Moseller, Aged 13, Held for Trial in General Sessions Court

Asheville, July 6.—George Shaver, of Spartanburg, but recently a resident of Asheville, is under arrest at Spartanburg charged with the abduction of Pearl Moseller, the 13-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. S. Moseller, of Asheville. The arrest of Shaver was made at the instance of the enraged father of the young bride and according to reports received here, the bridegroom will now have to stand trial in the South Carolina courts on a charge of abduction.

WAS FRIENDLY WITH WHITE

Up to Last September, Five Months After Marriage, Mrs. Thaw Used White's Automobile on Occasion, Says Chauffeur—Statement Discredited by Mrs. Thaw
New York, July 6.—That Mrs. Thaw and Stanford White were on friendly terms up to last September, is the assertion made in a signed statement given out to-day by John Burns, who was employed by White as a chauffeur. Burns says in his statement that on two occasions, once in February and again in September, 1905, the electric car which he drove was placed at Mrs. Thaw's disposal by White. The first of these occasions occurred on the morning of the latter part of September of that year. The use of the electric machine was discontinued at that time, he says, because of the persistent following of the car by a mob of men on foot and also in hansoms, runabouts and automobiles.

HAS LEFT SPARTANBURG

Police Officers Fail to Locate Child-Wife of George Shaver, Who Disappeared During His Preliminary Hearing

MRS. THAW'S MOTHER TALKS

I have been maliciously misrepresented. My story will be told at the proper time. Am not in strict seclusion. Have received all friends, but denied all reporters."

GOOD POST FOR VIRGINIAN
