PAUPERISM AND IMMIGRATION.

More Than Half of the White Occupants of Almshouses in the United States are Foreign-Born—Percentage of Negro Paupers in South Surprisingly Low—Interesting Facts Gathered by Census Bureau.

Washington, Oct. 23.—Pauperism and immigration are treated in a bulletin of the census bureau issued by that department to-day. In 1899 there were 27,883 foreign-born white paupers in almshouses of the United States, and in 1900 their number had increased to 27,841, while the number of native white paupers had, during the same period, largely diminished. Since 1900 the figures have increased in an even larger ratio.
