

RURAL DISTRICTS EXEMPT

CIGARETTE BILL FALLS DOWN.

The Floyd Bill Exempting Rural Districts from the Operation of the Compulsory Vaccination Law Goes Through South Carolina Legislature...

There was a sensational discussion on the floor of the House this afternoon on the Floyd bill, which is designed to exempt the rural districts from the operation of the compulsory vaccination law.

"To-day that woman and child are under the rod," declared Mr. Floyd. "I tell you the people are not going to stand for this sort of thing."

The law does not protect us from unprincipled doctors, we will take the law in our own hands. The House, on two roll-calls, refused to kill the bill.

There was an interesting and determined fight in the House to-day over the Senate bill of Mr. Blease to prohibit the manufacture and sale of cigarettes and cigarette paper in the State of South Carolina.

It looks to-night as if the impeding department will not be hampered by the hostile attitude of the House, which reduced the expense allowance from \$10,000 to \$3,000.

The dispensary people have secured agreement on the part of the Senate to amend the bill to wind up the affairs of the institution, so as to hold the real estate, worth \$150,000, until next session.

ANDREWS FAILS FOR \$140,000.

Mr. E. M. Andrews, Furniture Dealer, Files Voluntary Petition in Bankruptcy in District Court—Assets, \$90,000.

Special to the Observer. Greensboro, Feb. 14.—In the United States District Court here to-day, Mr. E. M. Andrews, who owns and conducts a chain of stores in North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia, was adjudged bankrupt upon his own petition.

The preferred creditors are a number of employees in the Andrews chain of stores, and the amount of preferred claims is \$1,977. Of the other liabilities, \$26,857.11 is secured and the remainder unsecured.
