**WINBORNE RETRACTS.**

Winborne asked the House to allow him to make a personal statement, and said: "Saturday night I rose to a question of personal privilege in connection with an article in The Raleigh Times. I knew the article was absolutely false and I hoped the editor had been imposed upon. Last night the editor of the Times and myself had a conference and there was no difficulty in coming to an understanding. The editor of the paper had no fault against me and will state in his paper this afternoon that there was a mistake made. The editor has acted the part of an honorable gentleman and I retract what I said about him. He explained to me the difficulty about divulging the name of the man who gave the information to the corporation. I was satisfied that this exposure would involve several in a serious difficulty. Manning said he had nothing about the matter, but thought it unnecessary to say anything about the canals in connection with the alleged spite against the Aberdeen & Asheville Railway. The fact about the matter was that he, himself, introduced the suggestion of a 50-mile limit to the charter which would have included the Aberdeen & Asheville road. Before the committee, the president of that road had stated that for 12 years he had had 50 mileage books at 2 cents a mile and that the road had a mileage of 90 miles. His information was in the possession of Manning, then he introduced a number of other roads of over 50 miles, which are included in the 2-cent rate and declared that he had placed a limit which would have excluded the Atlantic & North Carolina road from Charlotte to its point, which is largely owned by the State from the 24-cent rate. It would have been infeasible and a limit of 50 miles might have been placed on the short lines of less than 100 miles so the idea of any discrimination against Mr. Manning's road, or any other road, was not in his mind. He stated that he had no objection to the publication of the information of the House and that he was willing to publish in his paper the fact that he had been imposed upon by the State.
