

## Easter Songs and Sermons

"The day of resurrection! Earth, tell it out abroad! The Passover of gladness, The Passover of God, From death to life eternal, From earth into the sky, Our Christ hath brought us over With hymns of victory."

For forty days and forty nights the Church has observed a season of fasting and prayer. Friday, the day of crucifixion, its services took on a sadder tone, the devout worship of Lent concentrating in the solemn devotional services which marked the death of the Christ on the cross. Saturday there was a silence—a period of abstinence and individual prayer, a period of mourning for the One, hushed in death, who lay in the tomb, and this morning, with the dawn of the glorious Easter Day, the Church throws off her garb of sorrow and proclaims with Alleluia a Saviour risen from the dead.

Around the earth, to-day the anthems of praise, harmonizing in the one grand note of inspiration, will ascend from sweet-voiced choirs, and the melody of triumph—triumph over death and the grave, will be re-echoed from the hearts of Christian millions. It is the most general of religious festivals, and all Christendom to-day will live and breathe the joy of the Saviour's resurrection, as a few months ago it acclaimed a Saviour's birth.

Cast aside the sombre garb of black, the Church dons her gayest apparel, and the sweet flowers, which have burst into blossom at the call of spring, plaintively symbolic of the resurrection of their Creator, will deck the altar and altar in beautiful profusion, lending mute testimony to the doctrine that all Christian pulpits will proclaim.
