Washington, April 1.—Two features marked the opening of the second week's racing at Benning, the regular Easter Monday steeplechase with \$750 added, and a handicap for 3-year-olds with \$500 added. Three favorites, two second choices and an outsider won the six events in the steeplechase. Pioneer, the odds-on favorite, won by a length and a half. In the handicap Tickle got away in front and never was headed, the favorite Silkway getting the place.

**HE ENRICHED CARNEGIE.**  
John Brislin, Inventor, Who Became Blind, Died in Poverty.

John Brislin, inventor of the massive rolling-mill machinery by which beams or iron weighing tons are run through the rolls, and through which Andrew Carnegie made most of his millions, died here to-night, at the age of 74, blind and in poverty.

Carnegie and Brislin were boyhood friends. Brislin and Anton Vinnac, another workman, after years of experimenting, perfected the rolling-mill machinery that revolutionized the steel industry. Then they discovered that their secret was known, and soon the Carnegie Steel Company was using their invention. They ever afterward asserted that their models were stolen.

They brought suit, and were awarded the ownership of patents valued at \$40,000,000, but this verdict was reversed on a technicality. They had no money to continue the fight, but they spurred the Carnegie Company's offer of \$20,000 for a settlement. Vinnac died of grief and Brislin went blind.

It is said that on Saturday Brislin received a letter, supposed to be from Carnegie. "Everything will be all right now," said he. "Carnegie knows all about it."
