Asheville, May 6 .- For the first time in probably ten years the Republican and Democrats of Asheville will oppose each other at the polls to-morrow for control of the city government in a straight party fight. The Republicans early during the municipal campaign determined to take theirs straight this year and a ticket containing only the RHE names of loyal Republicans was nominated.
