

Cotton

New York, May 20.—The large outside interest in the cotton market has to-day been more or less nervous by persistent rumors emanating from the opposition to the effect that the New York Cotton Exchange would be successful in its motion to dismiss my suit and that this success would mean my defeat in my effort to reform the New York contract, and in consequence make practicable delivery here on July contracts of a large quantity of low grade cotton. I do not share this view. I have confidence in the equity of our American judicial proceedings and believe that I shall win. Moreover, my legal resources are not by any means as yet exhausted.

Coupled with this influence has been a report of Habersham King, denying the seriousness of the crop damage so generally reported. As against this I have hundreds of telegrams from the best informed and most sagacious people in the South to the effect that the damage to the crop already done is irremediable, and I continue to believe in much higher prices for cotton. That the progress toward higher prices will be punctuated by reactions goes without saying. It is now a broad cotton market, in which the public is largely interested, but the factors at work, namely, the huge consumption, the crop damage and the continuous appreciation in the prices of all commodities, resulting from the increased production of gold will be influenced, in my opinion, something more than ephemeral in their effect.


