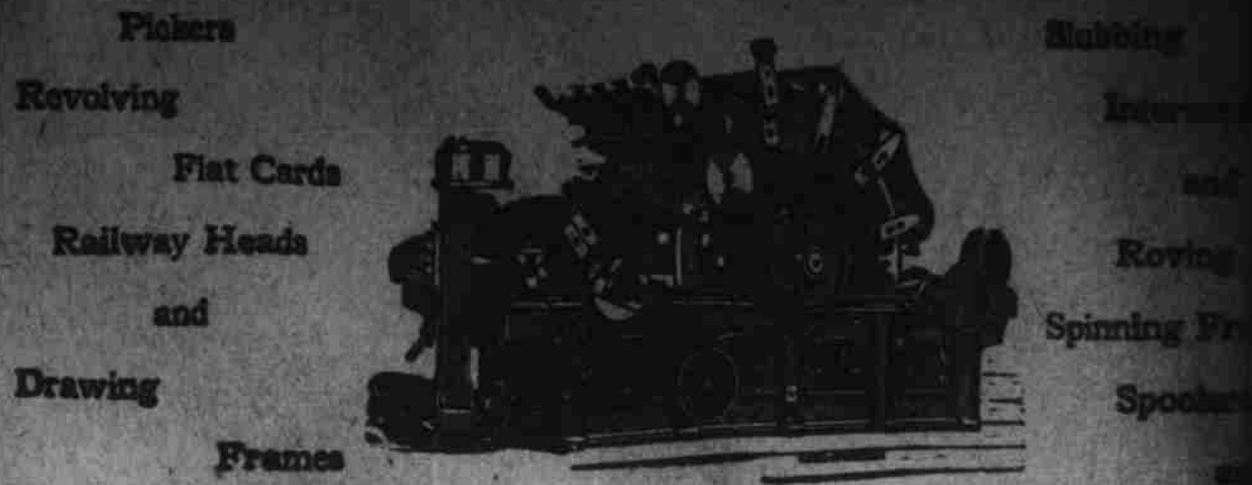

...Mentally, Leon Brandt is fearless and aggressive, having fought his way, at the mayoralty election in Greensboro in 1906, into the heart of a board of aldermen, a loner and but untried minority in a powerful and antagonistic, where things go wrong, according to his convictions, and I recall that he and another alderman some months ago bolted a distasteful municipal meeting and that an officer was deputized with the power of sergeant-at-arms to bring them back.

...If we are to continue the observance of Confederate Memorial Day throughout the South, let us do so with heads up before the world, imbued with the sacredness of the cause, and no uncertain tones from the tongue of the orator who, the central figure in a solemn and impressive ceremonial, becomes for the hour the historian of a mighty struggle which gave to the enlightened world the name of a sore beset little republic as the synonym of valor, fortitude, self-sacrificing patriotism and lofty devotion to principle. Decorating the graves of those who from bloody fields and the hospital ward "climbed fast to God," and looking around at their line of gray-headed survivors who tottered, fighting and starving, down to Appomattox, we say, "These men fought for a cause that was right," not "for a cause they believed to be right." It is an insult to the memory of the great leader, Lee, "without fear and without reproach," the Paladin captains grouped about him, and the wonderful "man with the gun," to pillory them in history as battling with flashing sword and bayonet about a flag with "error" scrawled across the stars and bars. These men fought for truth; they were no blended followers, weak martyrs of a political myth—no such men in all that host as Cowper's:

"Man, on the dubious waves of error tossed, His ship half-foundered and his compass lost, Sees, far as knows vision can command, A sleeping foe, and fancies it his land; Spreads every canvas, every shewy plie; Makes for it, pants for it, enters it—and dies!"

The memorial address at Fayetteville was delivered by Mr. John R. Tolar, prominent in the business life of both New York and Fayetteville, not old enough to have served in the ranks, but the son of a Confederate soldier of notable bravery and fidelity. If I were to eulogize a "masterly effort of lofty and burning eloquence," my friends would pay me no thanks for my fulsome words. It was something better than all this, maybe—the modest but heartfelt greeting of a modest man to the aged men whom he loves, because they fought, and marched by the father's side in days that tried the stoutest heart. It was the outpouring of a heart throbbing with devotion to his people and his native land, and to the history and traditions of the Old South, as famous and illustrious as the New South is splendid and powerful. No more graceful tribute could have been paid to Southern womanhood; and, altogether, Mr. Tolar's clear-cut talk had the right ring, for which both daughters and veterans thank him heartily.
