#### Chicago Grain and Provision.

Chicago, May 23.—Sunshine, seasonable temperatures and much-needed rain in the west softened the wheat market today, prices melting away to the extent of 2% to 2 1/2% under the influence of the more favorable weather conditions. The market was weak all day and at the close the July option showed a loss of 2 1/2% to 2 3/4%; Sept. 2 3/4% and Dec. 2 1/2%. Coarse grains were similarly affected, July corn declining 3/4 to 3/8 and July oats 1/8. Provisions closed unchanged to 1/8 lower.
