WORK BEING PUSHED. New Library Building Almost Completed—The President's Mansion of Colonial Style Will Soon be Ready for Occupancy—Better Than Ever. Chapel Hill, May 28.—Work on the several new buildings that are in course of erection at the University has been pushed very rapidly by the University as possible toward completion by commencement. The new library building is approaching its final form. All of the outside work has been done on the walls and the sheeting of the roof is in place ready to receive the tiling, which is already on the ground. It is easy to see that the building, when completed, will present quite a handsome appearance. One of the chief events of commencement will occur in the exercises incident to the laying of the corner stone of the new library. This will be held Saturday by the Grand Lodge Masons. The President's mansion is also nearing completion. It had been hoped that Dr. Yenable could occupy it for the present commencement, but delay in construction rendered this impossible. The building, which is one of the largest and finest residences in the village, is built in the colonial style of architecture and is situated on one of the finest sites on Franklin street. The new infirmary is being constructed as rapidly as possible in order that it may be ready for occupancy by the opening of the next year. However the work of the building has not risen much above its foundation as yet. The new infirmary is greatly needed here and the authorities are anxious to see it ready for service. The third floor of the Y. M. C. A. is now being finished up for service as a dormitory. It will contain three large rooms which will be ready for use during commencement. All of the rooms in the building proper will be fitted out for commencement as they are intended to remain permanently hereafter. With the completion of its three new buildings and the dormitory in the Y. M. C. A., the University will be much better equipped for 1907 than it has ever been before.

EVIDENCE NOT SUFFICIENT. The Negro Charged With Setting Fire to the Ledger Building Released—Loss Adjusted by Special Agent Price—A Prosperous Year for Limestone College. Special to The Observer. OXFORD NEEDS MONEY. University Now Too Poor to Supply Proper Scientific Training in Some Fields. Outlook. The first public act of Lord Curzon as chancellor of the University of Oxford was the publication of an appeal asking for \$1,250,000 to meet the pressing needs of the university, among which he enumerates the promotion of modern and scientific studies and the maintenance of the Bodleian Library. In many departments of science, he declares, Oxford is unable, for want of necessary funds and appliances, to supply a scientific basis for practical work, and an electrical laboratory and provision for giving scientific training for the practical profession of engineering are greatly needed. He says that the gift of Cecil Rhodes, the greatest benefaction which the university has received of late years, has brought with it a burden, adding, as it does, 200 men from all parts of the British empire, from the United States and from Germany to the body of undergraduates, and imposing upon the university the necessity of offering the newcomers all that
