New York, June 6.—Flip Flap, showing great improvement over her last race, easily won the Westminster handicap of \$10,000 at Gravesend to-day. She was admirably ridden by J. Martin, who had his first mount since his suspension at Belmont Park. Lady Winifred, backed down from 4 to 1 to 9 to 5, favorite at post time, got a lead of 6 lengths at the start for the Criterion stakes and was never headed. Summary:

OFF ON 240-MILE RACE.

Six Torpedo Boat Destroyers Start From the Scotland Lightship For Cape Henry, Va.

New York, June 6.—Six torpedo boat destroyers started to-day on a 240-mile race from the Scotland lightship to Cape Henry, Va. They were the flagship Whipple and the Truxton, Worden, Stewart, Hull and Hopkins, comprising the second torpedo flotilla.

The weather was fairly favorable for a fast race when the swift craft ranged behind the starting line for a flying start. The wind was fresh and the sea was lumpy.

At the finish of the race, the destroyers will proceed to Hampton Roads to be present at the Jamestown Exposition on Georgia Day, June 10.
