Georgia Railroads Will Cense War Against Reduced Rates on Stoves— New Rates Effective June 20. Atlanta, Ga., June 7 .- The rati-

The railroads to-day withdrew their writ of error to the Supreme Court of the United States and will put the rates into effect about June 20.
