

SMILEY FEELS DISTRESS

One Victim of the Disease at a School... The Trade Union of the... Disposed of—Reception to Judge Webb.

Special to The Observer. Wakeboro, Oct. 12.—A fatal case of scarlet fever, which developed here about ten days ago, is causing some excitement, especially among the students of the graded school.

Judge J. L. Webb, of Shelby, is making good progress with the civil docket here. Several cases of peculiar interest have been disposed of. In one, that of R. J. Phillips vs. J. J. Little, the plaintiff was suing to recover the value of a mule and harness he claims to have traded to the defendant when he (the plaintiff) was so drunk that he did not know what he was doing.

Two cases against Mr. T. R. Tomlinson were disposed of. These suits were brought by Mr. C. M. Burns and both were of an unusual nature for this court. Mr. Burns sued Mr. Tomlinson for two counts. First he alleges that during the month of February, 1905, Mr. Tomlinson entered into a written contract to deliver to him one hundred bales of cotton during the month of the following October, price to be 7.50 a pound.

The question of a location for the bank building was brought before the board and it was decided to purchase the corner lot belonging to Mr. J. C. McLean, where the red-front store now stands. The bank will move the wooden structure of the corner and will erect a handsome and commodious structure for its banking house.

It is the purpose of the new bank to keep business just as usual in its habits, and arrangements will be made to occupy the room next door to Miller's drug store until the bank building is erected. The room it will occupy temporarily is the one formerly occupied by the Bank of Mooreville when it was first organized.
