STIEFF PLANO CO'S JAMESTOWN EXHIBIT.

Local Concern Has One of Most At-tractive Booths in Liberal Arts Building.

Baltimore American, Sept. 26th. One of the most handsome and at-

tractive booths in the Liberal Arts Building, at the Jamestown Exposition, is that of the Stieff Plano Com-pany, of North Liberty street, this city. It is 17x32 feet, and is located in a corner of the interior court, in

a prominent place. The booth is made of staff and wood and is inclosed in plate glass, so that it may be converted into a private room, and the full tones of the Stieff planos heard to an advantage. There are four entrances to the booth. The interior color scheme is green, red and gold, and

is lighted by heavy drop incandescent lights, covered with ground glass globes, which diffuse a soft radiance. The booth contains a Stieff patent electric cabinet, to preserve music rolls against dampness and swelling, These rolls are used in the Stieff player, and the firm states it has not had a roll of music spolled during the entire time of the Exposition,

In the booth on exhibition, also, is one art grand plano, worth \$1,500, of the most expert wood-carvers in the Stieff factory did 800 hours' work


