WOULD ENJOIN FAYETTEVILLE. Haymount County Made a Part of the City on the Cape Fear, Says It Was Not Done in a Proper Manner—New Realty and Insurance Company Organizes—Mr. W. M. Morgan's Condition Improves.

Fayetteville, Oct. 24.—Citizens of Haymount, the wealthiest and most populous suburb of the city, recently incorporated within city limits under an act of the Legislature and now known as eighth ward, have begun proceedings to enjoin the city of Fayetteville from exercising control over said Haymount on the following causes of action:

That the act of the Legislature extending corporate limits of the City of Fayetteville was not passed in accordance with the law, in that it that it passed two readings in the Senate on the same day without a roll call, whereas the State constitution expressly requires that there is no record of the concurrence of the Senate in such amendments made by the House; also that the act made by the people residing in the extended district only, whereas the election held allowed all persons to vote, including the citizens of the original seven wards; and further that the boundary as set forth in the act is in violation of the extended limits as claimed by the City of Fayetteville.
