At the close of business on December 3, there was a relaxation in the conditions and the supply of bank credits became appreciably increased.

The most immediate consequence to the country of this revolution of customary arrangements of bank deposits is seen in the figures of November bank clearings, which fell 23.2 per cent. compared with November of last year.

The causes which produced these results are seen to be in course of correction in the easing of money rates, the decline in excessive premiums on exchange at interior cities, the reduction of the premium on currency and the passing of the fears of depositors regarding banks.
