Lincolnton, Jan. 6.—Quite a lively shooting scrape took place here Sunday afternoon between Willie Smirke and Lem Glover, both negroes. Smirke attempted to shoot Glover, who knocked the gun to one side when it was discharged, and ball passing between his fingers but doing no serious damage. Glover then wrenched the gun from his assailant and began firing on him, but Smirke managed to jump through a window and escape. Officers were summoned, but before they arrived on the scene Smirke had made good his escape. The infant son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert A. Hooser died yesterday morning at 11 o'clock and was buried yesterday afternoon in the Methodist cemetery.
