Sales estimated at 650.00 against 400.000 bales the revious day and 25:000 bales on Tuesday. The market opened firm at an advance of 11 to 22 points on a rush of evernight buying orders and covering. This was better than due on the cables, although Liverpool a little more than responded to yesterday's focal gairs, and during the carly session prices reacted 6 or 7 points under heavy regulating, part of which was credited to the buil leader. But offerings were not aggressive and the market roon fried up again on general buying, a relevant of buil support and demand from spot houses. After selling up to 11.6 for March and H.5 for May there was a second reaction of 7 to 8 points, followed quickly by another builge carrying prices to the highest point of the day with March touching 11 63 and May 11.7 or 39 to 40 points and the last and May 11.7 or 39 to 40 points above the low level of yesterday. The close was a little off from the best under realizing.
