THE COTTON MARKET INACTIVE.

Prices Ease Off Under Comparatively Moderate Offerings as There Was No Snap to the Buying—The Stable Breaks Sharply After Midday Following the Announcement of the Failure of a Local Commission House.

New York, April 16.—Trading in cotton was not active to-day and prices eased off under comparatively moderate offerings, with the close barely steady at a net decline of 1/4 to 1/2 points, which carried the market back to within 3 to 5 points of the lowest for the season on an active month. Sales were estimated at 12,000 bales.

The market opened steady at an advance of 1/4 to 1/2 points in response to firmer Liverpool cables and a renewal of yesterday's covering movement. But there was no snap to the buying, and while there was talk of cooler weather in the South there seemed to be nothing in the weather news to excite apprehension as to the crop outlook so early in the season.

At any rate the market failed of under realizing by recent buyers for a local cotton commission house. This firm was generally known to be embarrassed earlier in the week, the heavy liquidation of Monday having been attributed to it, and the news of the suspension of its local commission house, the circulation of the statement through the country seemed to bring in some selling orders from outside sources, however, and the close was within a point or two of the lowest of the day. The Liverpool market will be closed until Tuesday morning. New York and New Orleans will be closed on Friday and Saturday, reopening Monday morning, while the New Orleans will be closed again on Tuesday for spring movements.

Receipts at the ports to-day 12,000 bales against 11,100 last week and 12,100 last year. For the week 40,000 against 39,000 last week and 33,000 last year. To-day's receipts at New Orleans 4,742 against 2,530 last year, and at Houston 1,839 against 3,708 last year.

MORE LIFE IN STOCKS.

The Tone of the Market Quite Strong at Times and the Demand Which Causes the Advance Attributed Largely to Professionals—Union Pacific a Leader.

New York, April 16.—The stock market showed more life to-day than was expected on the eve of a triple holiday. The tone was quite strong at times. The demand which advanced prices was attributed largely to professional origin. Some attention was attracted by the announcement, apparently inspired, that the Erie financial settlement was not the eleventh hour makeshift it has been assumed to be, but was the carrying out of a definite plan having the consent of the company's bankers and prepared some time before as an alternative to cover the failure of the plan officially offered. Union Pacific was a leader in the day's market and absorbed a large share of the total transactions. Some effect was produced by reiteration of reports of plans for a comprehensive advance in freight rates by the railroads and of the sanction of this action by the Inter-State commerce commission.

Known movements of money up to Wednesday night indicated a cash gain by the banks of nearly \$10,000,000, after allowing for the one million dollars engaged for export to Paris.

Call money loaned at high as 2 per cent. compared with a maximum of 1 1/2 per cent. on previous days this week. The bond market showed a considerable variety and a firm tone, although the aggregate volume was not large.

Hubbard Bros. & Co.'s Cotton Letter. Special to The Observer. New York, April 16.—The usual holiday market with perhaps more than usual elasticity has been the characteristic to-day. The trade interest was very small outside business light and equalizing process made fluctuations unusually erratic. Advice from Liverpool showed a better tone for future delivery, but the business depression continues and a failure is noted of some magnitude there. A concern here embarrassed by declining and announced its suspension but without effect as its interests had been distributed some days ago. Expecting some improvement local dealers bought at the opening, but sold and depressed prices when the demand was not forthcoming. As the interests became smaller prices were easily moved and declined under the weight of offerings from no special determinable cause.

Dry Goods Market. New York, April 16.—The dry goods market was quiet for the day. Jobbers report that they are selling goods steadily in a small way. The men's wear trade is generally quiet on staples, but fancies for all in some houses are being depleted. There is also a call for spring goods on cash orders, but on particular colors. Several of the large carpet houses have concluded to hold their fall openings on May 4th, the date of the big carpet action. Ray silk is fluctuating in value but the late Southern market appears firm. Heavy cotton goods are weak and lower.

Futures opened steady and closed up to four points above the close yesterday, as a result of favorable advices from Liverpool, where the opening was much better than looked for. There was little activity following the opening, and the market exhibited a sensitiveness that was not calculated to result in any lasting improvement. Spots, which were firm early in the day, soon became quiet and the market turned to a do-nothing future. The early session witnessed some buying by shorts to cover over the three days of holiday attendant upon Easter, but this barely served to check for a short time the downward tendency of the market, which was steady. The active months were 10 to 16 points below the close yesterday.
