

quate to the necessities of the situation. Our city is growing and the need of a modern, commodious, wellcoulpped building has become imper-We are painfully handlcapped in our efforts to maintain our hospital in the use of such an indifferent building and such scant equipment. Under existing conditions it is simply impossible to secure the enthusiastic interest and support of our lady church members in hospital work.

2. The failure to erect a suitable structure brings us into unfavorable and humiliating comparison with aggressive forces in city hospital work. When the Episcopalians want a hos-pital, they get it. When the Roman Catholics want a hospital, they build

it. When a few enterprising physi-clans and business men want a hos-pital, they erect it. When we want a hospital what do we get? Let the corner of West Trade and Mint street answer.

3. In our judgment, the longer the erection of the new building is de-layed, the greater will be our loss of prestige and influence. About two years ago the question of a new building was agitated. It was intimated, if not alleged, that the movement was initiated in the interest of a number of physicians of the city. In the judgment of all right-thinking, fair-mind-ed persons this notion has been ex-ploded.
