Wednesday Was the Hottest Day of the Year-Naval Reserves Off For Cruise-District Organizer For Woodmen.

Wilmington, July 16 -- Yesterday Total for 24 hours coding \$ p m as the hottest day of the present Total for the month was the hottest day of the present summer here. The thermometer reg-istered 93 and the humidity was intense, With a little over two thou-sand excursionists in the city the suburban car line to the beach was taxed to its capacity to handle the erowds from the seashore.
