A BUILDING FOR WOMEN AT CENTRAL INSANE HOSPITAL

Commission Has Made an Order of a Two-Story Entibling to Contain any Rooms—Will He First clony Ever Established For Woman at Any Institution of This Kind—Vale Colony Will Be Located on rimes Land—Eight Cottages For Imployes Bulle—Patients Now Institution Number 512.

Superintendent James McICee, of the Central Hospital for the Insans here, says that Mr. Weddington, of the hospital commission, has arranged for connection of the institution with the sewer which the penitentiary built two years ago and which connects with the city sewer system. Ever alines the hospital was built in 1856 the sewerage has been emptied into a small stream which flows by a place small stream which flows by a place where Caraleigh Phosphate and Cotton Mills are now located. The building is one of the best ever constructed in the State. Since it was cometed a wing for women has been astructed, followed by one for men, and in the rear of the latter an annex has lately been built at a cost of \$68-000. It is the set purpose of the com-mission to as nearly as possible equalize this hospital and the one at Morganton, and also the two districts into which the State is divided for

BUILDING FOR WOMEN. The hospital commission has made an order for a two-story building to contain 80 rooms at a location directcontain 80 rooms at a location directly south of the hospital and in a grove of pines overlooking a wide stretch of country. This is of particular interest because it is the first colony for women ever established at any institution of the kind. The convalescent women will be taken there and very delightful quarters will be arranged for them. The dimensions of the building will be 233x87, two stories and basement. Special sewing rooms will be provided with all sorts of amusements, attractive sun parlors, etc. City water, which is in use in the main building, will be supplied and the food will be carried from the main kitchen in covered carts, this beenain kitchen in covered carts, this be-

ing the system in use at Morganton.

The colony for males will be located on the Grimes lands purchased last year and this will have three buildings, each of two stories.
