

EIGHT CONGRESSMEN SURE

TENTH DISTRICT IS IN DOUBT

Congressional Returns Unusually Slow Coming in From Eighth and Tenth Districts, Both of Which Are Probably Republican—Chairman Klutts Virtually Concedes Election of Cowles Over Hackett—Official Count May Be Necessary to Determine Result in Tenth—Chairmen Lee and Chairman Logan Both Claim That Their Candidates Are Elected—Other Eight Districts Are Safely Democratic.

Returns received by The Observer to 5 o'clock this morning indicate that North Carolina will have two Republicans Congressmen in the Sixty-first Congress—Cowles and Grant. Democratic Chairman Theo F. Klutts at 1:30 virtually conceded the election of Charles H. Cowles over Hon. R. N. Hackett, and the returns to The Observer, though very meagre, seem to confirm this concession. In the tenth district an official count may be necessary to determine as to John G. Grant and W. T. Crawford, both chairmen claiming that their candidate is elected. It has been known for some days that Congressman Hackett's seat was in jeopardy, but the result in the tenth is a decided surprise, as it was believed that Congressman Crawford would be returned by a good-sized majority.

The Congressmen of the other eight districts are re-elected without a doubt but their majorities are reduced.
