New York, Jan. 25 -- Realizing, by the Western and Wall Street holders taking profits, continued to-day until the weight of these sales broke the market some 14 points, when it ceased for the moment is noticeable that when these parties inke profits they do not buy again in the same positions which they sell, but they pass over to the new crops. Their theory appears to be that as all the cotton in the world cost money to carry; that when they replace their sales from time to time they will buy a cheaper position. In the meantime the cotton trade have bought the old crop which the outsiders have sold, expecting spinners to buy from them, The market closed steady at a slight reaction from the lowest point, which is expected to cause a rally in Liverpool to-morrow from one to two points. What surprised the trade was the increase in the movement.
