

WHERE THE MONEY WILL GO

APPROPRIATIONS FOR STATE INSTITUTIONS

Appropriations Committee of the State Legislature Will Make Its Final Report To-Day—A Forecast of the Expenditure of the State's Money—Half a Million Dollars to Be Expended for the Three Hospitals For the Insane—Appropriations For Homes for the Care of the Deaf, Blind and Mute—New Institution Will Be Organized—News Items of Interest From the State Capital.

Observer Bureau. The House of Representatives today made its report on the appropriations for the State institutions. The report is a long and important document, and it is expected that it will be passed by the Legislature today.

As to the State Hospital for the Insane, the report provides for an expenditure of \$500,000 for the three hospitals. It also provides for the establishment of a new institution for the care of the deaf, blind and mute.
