MIR. S. H. FARROW DEAD.

Native of Charlotte and formerly a Well-Known Citizen of This Place. Miss Affie Farrow of 311 Health at Home of Daughter in Concord.

Mr. S. H. Farrow died yesterday afternoon at 5.45 o'clock at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Williamson Morris, in Concord, after about a year's illness with Bright's disease.

About two years ago he suffered a stroke of paralysis. He had lived for years near Newell but had gone to Concord a number of months ago. The funeral will be held this afternoon in Concord at 4 o'clock. He was a member of the Methodist church.

Mr. Farrow was born in Charlotte 50 years ago, being a son of Rev. Thomas Farrow, a Methodist minister, and his wife, who was Miss Mary Harrison, daughter of Mr. Samuel Harrison. He is survived by his wife, who was Miss Virginia Morris; two sons, Messrs. William, of Charlotte, and Marion and three daughters, the eldest of whom is Mrs. Morris.

About twenty-five years ago, Mr. Farrow was a prominent and well-known citizen of Charlotte. He devoted himself for a while to farming, a aid of endeavor in which he applied himself industriously and intelligently. He was for many years a deputy sheriff under Sheriff M. E. Alexander and made a faithful and efficient official.
