Mr. Julius Lucas was next charged with assaulting Mr. Ray with a gun. He was bound over to court under a \$100 bond which was given by Mr. Ray. It was indicated by Mrs. Lucas for trespass on her property, the hearing of this case being continued to March 26. Ray was next tried for assault on Mrs. Lucas with an axe, the magistrate reserving his decision until the above date, when more light will be thrown on the complicated situation.

To Celebrate Liberty Point Declaration of Independence.

Fayetteville, March 20.—It was announced to-day that Chief Justice Walter Clark, of Raleigh, had accepted the invitation to deliver the principal address at the celebration of the Liberty Point Declaration of Independence, to be held here June 21. An enthusiastic meeting of those concerned in the preparations for the celebration was held Thursday afternoon and the committee feel assured that the occasion will be a notable day in the history of Fayetteville.

To Dredge Creeks For Gold.

Rollins, March 20.—Allen & Little, who have been working the Miller gold mining property at Blythe town for the past two years, are trying to buy 1,000 acres of bottom land along Silver and Muddy creeks. If successful they will install four large dredges which have been working in Colorado and dredge the land for gold.

CONTRACT FOR PLUMBING. Tedium Land Case Finished at Last. The long-drawn-out land case of L. Blumberg vs. John Lang which was begun in the Superior Court last Saturday was finished late yesterday afternoon and given to the jury. The argument of the attorneys in the case lasted from noon Wednesday until 5 o'clock yesterday, and throughout the case has been as tedious and slow as if it were a notorious murder trial. The jury is expected to render a verdict when court opens this morning. The litigation is over a small strip of land about 18 feet in width adjoining the north end of the Glenn Rock Hotel and covering a part of the small stream that crosses deep street at that point. Inasmuch as both plaintiff and defendant derive their titles from the same source many of the antecedent controversies were cut out. The case has been in the Supreme Court twice before and the costs have already more than eaten up the value of the lot.
