

CALHOUN CASE NEAR END.

Francis J. Heney Will Conclude the Arguments To-Day—Is Bitter in His Arguments, Making a Severe Arraignment of W. M. Abbott and Calhoun. San Francisco, June 17.—Francis J. Heney half completed to-night his closing argument for the prosecution in the case of Patrick Calhoun, charged with bribery.

THAW HEARING DEFERRED.

Matter Will Come Up at White Plains on July 6, Postponement Having Been Asked by State. White Plains, N. Y., June 17.—Harry K. Thaw will have to wait in the Matteawan asylum until July 6 for a hearing to determine whether he is now sane and in a condition to be released from the asylum. The case came up before Justice Mills here to-day on a writ of habeas corpus obtained by Thaw. Thaw's counsel, Charles Morschauer, wanted to go on with the hearing, but Mr. Clark, a representative of the Attorney General wanted to have the case transferred to New York county and District Attorney Jerome of New York, asked that the hearing be postponed in order to give him an opportunity to attend to other business. Justice Mills decided that the hearing would be held in White Plains.

HAT MANUFACTURERS SUED.

Associated Hat Manufacturers, Incorporated, Alleges That Sixteen Hat Manufacturing Firms Violated Terms of Agreement. Danbury, Conn., June 17.—Suits were brought in this city this afternoon by the Associated Hat Manufacturers, incorporated, of New York, against sixteen hat manufacturing firms in Danbury, Bethel and New Milford, for damages of \$25,000 from each, for alleged violation of the terms of agreements and the bonds that the United in the recent tie-up of the hating industry in Danbury and elsewhere throughout the country. Attachments aggregating more than \$300,000 were placed upon the real estate and bank accounts of the firms and corporations that are made defendants in the suits. The sixteen concerns sued made a settlement with the hat makers last week, and the suits are the outcome of that settlement, which was alleged to be in violation of the agreement and bond under which the manufacturers were organized.

MEAT INSPECTION SYSTEM.

Official Investigation of the Charges. Made by Former Inspector, is Begun—Sessions Behind Closed Doors. East St. Louis, Ill., June 17.—An official investigation of the charges against the government meat inspection system at the National Stock Yards here was begun to-day by a board, selected by Secretary Wilson, of the Agricultural Department, headed by Dr. A. D. Melvin, chief of the animal industries bureau. The sessions were held in the closed doors. J. H. Harms, the former inspector who brought the charges that caused the investigation, withdrew from the case when he was informed that the hearings would be held behind closed doors. A statement issued by the officials said: "Mr. Harms was assured that he would be afforded every opportunity to present evidence to substantiate his charges. He was told that it was the general policy of the department not to conduct public investigations, but that he would be furnished each morning with a copy of the stenographer's work of the day's proceedings. The committee will continue its investigation. It is in possession of a list of the witnesses, relied upon by Mr. Harms to substantiate his charges. This list was furnished to the department by Mr. Harms, and every man in it will be called before the board."

CONFESSES TO MURDER.

Negro Arrested in Columbus, O., Tells Police He Killed Engineer Holt - Between Greensboro and Durham Last October. Columbus, O., June 17.—Solomon Shepherd, alias William Thomas, a negro, yesterday confessed by accident to the Columbus police that he is wanted at Durham, N. C., for murder. He is held awaiting word from Durham.

Vanderbilt Auto Races To-Day.

Crown Point, Ind., June 17.—With a dull red sunset promising fair weather for the first of the Western Vanderbilt automobile races over the Crown Point-Lowell circuit of 23.6 miles to-morrow, the throngs began to arrive to-night. Excursion trains from every direction brought thousands, as did a constant stream of motor cars. In nearly every house in town and in Lowell, twelve miles away, every room was a bedroom to-night.

J. O. E. A. M. Change Ritual.

Detroit, Mich., June 17.—The National Council Junior Order of United American Mechanics to-day passed a resolution changing the ritual of the order so that it will contain three degrees instead of one. A resolution was passed accepting the offer of the Tennessee State Council to donate grounds and buildings for a home for old and indigent members of the order.

Two Trainers Lose Their Lives in Southern Wreck.

Columbia, S. C., June 17.—Engineer William H. Turner and fireman J. Young Carlisle, both of this city, lost their lives early this morning when Southern extra freight train, engine 275, southbound, was wrecked at Stux, a small station about seven miles southwest of Columbia. The locomotive and five cars left the rails. The cause of the wreck is unknown.

Egan, his counsel and all the witnesses in the recent suit brought by the Pennsylvania Sugar Refinery Company against the American Sugar Refining Company for alleged violations of the Sherman anti-trust law. It is understood that the case is to be considered by the grand jury on Monday.
