#### COLORED TEACHERS ADJOURN.

War on Tuberculosis Was Declared by the National Association-Officers For the Ensuing Year Elected.

Asheville, June 25 .- War on tuberulosis among negroes was declared to-day, when the National Association of Teachers in colored schools authorized the appointment of a committee to work up an interest in the prevention of tuberculosis in the sevral States, and to arrange for the formation of a colored national an.itubercular association.

Dr. C. P. Wertenbaker, of the publie health and marine hospital. Washington, D. C., delivered an address on 'How to Prevent Tuberculosia."

The association adjourned to-night with a strong address to the country, which took under consideration various phases of negro education, principal among which were the matter of bettering the rural schools, the special training of teachers, the increasing mortality of the race, and the need of corrective measures for the good of the negro boys.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: R. R. Wright. of Georgia, president, J. B. Dudley, North Carolina, vice president; Miss Ida C. Plummer, of the District of "olumbia, secretary; J. R. Lee, Alabama, corresponding secretary; N. B. Young, of Florida, treasurer; J. A. Martin, of Mississippi, registrar. The next session will be held in Oklahoma City, Okla. in July, 1910.

#### AT THE NATION'S CAPITAL.

The Most Important Happenings of a Day Briefly Summarized.

Washington, June 25 .- The most important happenings in the national capital to-day were as follows:

Just before the Senate adjourned about 7 o'clock to-night, Senator Aldrich, chairman of the finance committee, introduced the corporation tax amendment to the tariff bill, recommended by President Taft. It is expected that the Senate will take the amendment for consideration next Monday

To encourage American shipping, Senator Elkins introduced an amendment which would allow to American vessels a reduction of five per cent. in tariff duties.

Petroleum, linoleum and scrap iron tariff schedules were the principal ones discussed in the Senate. Senator Penrose's amendment fixing a duty of half cent a gallon on crude oil was lost. Increases over the House rates were made as follows On harness from 35 per vent. ad valorem to 40 per cent; on scrap iron from 50 cents to \$2.50 per ton; and on wire nails from 1-4 to 1-2 cent. and from 1-2 to 3-4 cent per pound. the former for those less, the latter for those an inch or more in length Stuart McNamara resigned as assistant district attorney to devote his whole time to the prosecution of the so-called libel cases
