

BAPTISTS OF STATE SUPPORT MISSIONS.

Secretary Livingston Johnson Says Apportionment is More Than Raised.

Rev. Livingston Johnson, corresponding secretary of the North Carolina Baptist Board of Missions, announced to-night in connection with the approaching annual session of the Southern Baptist Convention at Nashville, Tenn., May 13, that North Carolina wiil make a very fine showing, having raised more than her apportionment, which was \$52,-300 for foreign and \$35,000 for one missions.

The Foreign and Home Mission Boards were operating the past year on \$1,000,000 basis, \$443,750 for home and \$646,500 for foreign missions. Messages have come to Secretary Johnson that reports to the Southern Baptist Convention will show the amounts fully

Speaking of the convention and its approaching session at Nashville, Mr. Johnson said the Captist Sunday School Board has ust completed a splendid building at Nashville in which much fine stone from Mount Airy has been used. He says one of the biggest issues at this convention will be that centralizing the headquarters of the boards. Now, the Home Mission Board is located in Atlanta, the Foreign divided as to the advisability of consolidation, many contending that there is advantage in the present scattered centers of in-

### MANY CURES FOR HICCOUGHS

In the List Given Sufferers Should Be Able to Find One That Will Afford Relief.

Hiccoughs can be as troublesome as any of the minor ills which aggravate mankind. But from time out of mind there has been a remedy for every ill-and hiccoughs share the

lot of other ills in this respect. One old cure for hiccoughs is this: Take three or four preserved damsons in your mouth at a time, and swallow them by degrees. A temptation, this would seem to be, to children of another generation to

have hiccoughs. Water drinking often stops this trouble. The water should be slowly swallowed, not gulped down-swal-

lowed, like the damsons, by degrees. The best water treatment is this: Fill the mouth with cool water. Hold each forefinger over the lobe f medicine to verify his plea of the ear, closing it tight. Then

Still another remedy is sugar, and this acts like a charm with some persons. The sugar should be of the granulated sort, and a full teaspoongrancy, and the magistrate seemed ful should be taken at once. It should be swallowed slowly.

Holding the breath is sometimes efficacious. Hold it and count twenty or thirty, slowly.

In severe cases of hiccoughs accompanying illness, champagne, a spoonful at a time, is sometimes found of use. Sometimes, too, expert massage of the abdomen cures hiccoughs.
