

THIRTY-THREE YEARS AGO

 Rev. T. P. Bonner will organize a Bible Sunday school class at the Methodist church. All are invited to attend, both old and young.

Married in Morganton township, August 1, Mr. Joseph Propst and Miss Gertrude Carswell, granddaughter of Mr. M. D. Brittain. Rev. P. A. Whitener officiated.

Married in Smokey Creek township Sunday, August 5, by, and at the residence of Esq. J. S. Tilley, Dr. R. D. Jennings and Miss Maggie C. Abernathy, both of Rutherford College.

Hon. A. M. Waddell, Democratic candidate for elector for the State at large, will address the people at the court house in Morganton August 24. Let everybody come out and hear this distinguished orator.

In 1862 and 1863 Judge Clarke was adjutant of the 35th Regiment, commanded by Col. (now Senator) Ransom. In that regiment was the gallant company from Burke and Caldwell counties, commanded first by Capt. Eliza, and then by Capt. J. T. Johnson, who subsequently became colonel of the regiment. Judge Clarke was then a boy of fifteen, but he will doubtless be remembered by many of his old comrades.

Mr. J. F. Murrill, editor of the Hickory Press and Carolinian and a prohibitionist of the strictest sect, spoke in the court house last Tuesday to a large audience. The burden of his speech was to convince prohibitionists that their greatest friend was in the Democratic party, to bring about the great temperance reform; that every Democrat who voted for this third party was aiding to put us back under the negro rule, and not advancing the temperance cause but retarding its progress. We wish every prohibitionist in the country could have heard his speech.

With Judge Clark on the bench, Hon. W. H. Bower at the bar as solicitor and the model Clerk, Mr. S. T. Pearson at the desk, it is reasonable to suppose that the business of the court would be transacted correctly and with dispatch.

Messrs. S. B. Briggs of Yancey county and H. S. Blair of Caldwell county, both candidates for the Senate on the Democratic ticket in this district, spoke at the court house in Morganton last Tuesday and made a fine impression on our people. It goes without saying that they will be our next senators.

Judge Clark opened court at Morganton last Monday. He at once impressed our people as being possessed of great administrative ability. His charge was somewhat different from the old beaten track, but embraced all the law necessary for the guidance of the jurors in the discharge of their duties. He seems to be impressed with the idea that a sound and tedious charge is not so essential as the execution of the law. At the close of his charge he paid a very high compliment to the people of Burke county for the enterprising spirit they have manifested in the extensive repairs on our court house, which makes it as convenient as any in the State. He is very respectful to the gentlemen of the bar though firm in his rulings. In the beginning he adopted a much needed rule, which, that witnesses are required to be in the court room and not on the streets during court hours, which has heretofore retarded the progress of the court.
