OLD NEWSPAPER REFLECTS LIFE IN COUNTY SEAT 45 YEARS AGO

An age-yellowed copy of "The Cape Fear Pilot," oldest known of Lillington newspapers, was brought to The News office a day or so ago by Mr. W. M. Pearson of Chalybeate Springs. The copy, dated July 14, 1903, was addressed to Mr. Pearson. The Pilot, edited by J. T. McLean and published by the Pilot Publishing Company, was of four pages, 7 columns, and carried at its masthead the legends "Published Every Week at the Countyseat of Harnett" and "A Good Advertising Medium for Merchants in Lillington, Dunn, Angler and Raleigh."
