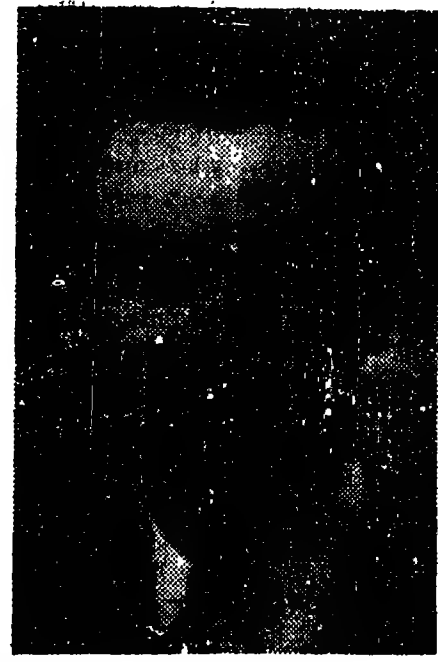

Lamar Simmons of Lillington has received a check from the government totaling \$490 for food he didn't get while he was a prisoner of war in Germany.

Serving as a pilot during the war, Lieutenant Simmons was shot down on January 11, 1944 and remained a prisoner of war in Germany until the end of the war when he was liberated in 1945.

Began Visits On Monday; No Friday Visits Are Listed

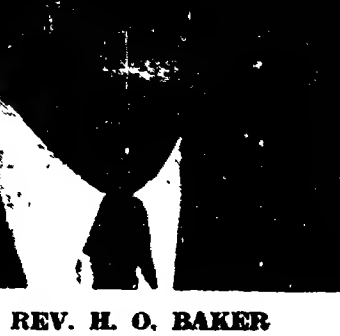
Beginning on Monday of this week the Harnett County Attendance Officer for the schools, Mr. R. T. Dixon, started on his rounds of checking up on absentee students.
