#### Honeybees Play Vital Farm Role


More than 80 per cent of the entire insect pollination service required for farm crops is provided by honeybees.

This fact is pointed out by W. A. Stephen, beekeeping specialist for the State College Extension Service, who says that no matter what you eat, what you wear, or where you live, honeybees play an important part in your life.

Stephen asserts that there are many specific examples of how the honeybees have increased the production of the seed necessary for plants used in soil conservation and the growing of forage, fiber and food

#### TIMELY FARM **QUESTIONS**

Answered at State College

Question: Please explain the visions of the new social security legislation as it affects farm work-

Answer: The expanded legislation covers hired farm and domestic workers (cooks or household workers on the farm) who are employed regularly. A worker is considered regular if (1) he works continuously for one farm operator during the operator from the worker's wages and energizes the blood with iron. continues to do farm work for at the operator. A new non-stir method of laundering wool blankets in automatic shrinkage problem in tests by Experiment Station bome economists. The idea is that of removing soil by soaking rather than agitation after 500 laundering tests of new and used

of improved small grain varieties for wool blankets in different washers. Blankets were measured for shrinkplanting in 1951. On the average farm, he adds, perhaps two acres age after five washings. Those given would be sufficient for this purpose. | four-minute washings shrank twice The farmer should plant certified as much as those in the washer only supply which can be cleaned and not only blankets but other wool used in planting his entire acreage fabric.

\*The non-stir or soak-cleaning was tried out successfully on 40 new and used wool blankets. New blankets laundered this way shrink only a trifle or not at all. Used blankets, badly shrunken in previous launderings, were reconditioned and came out four to six inches longer when finished by stretching and brushing.

Here's the method in seven steps: 1. Fill washer with lukewarm or hotter water, add a low-sudsing detergent, and dissolve by running the
