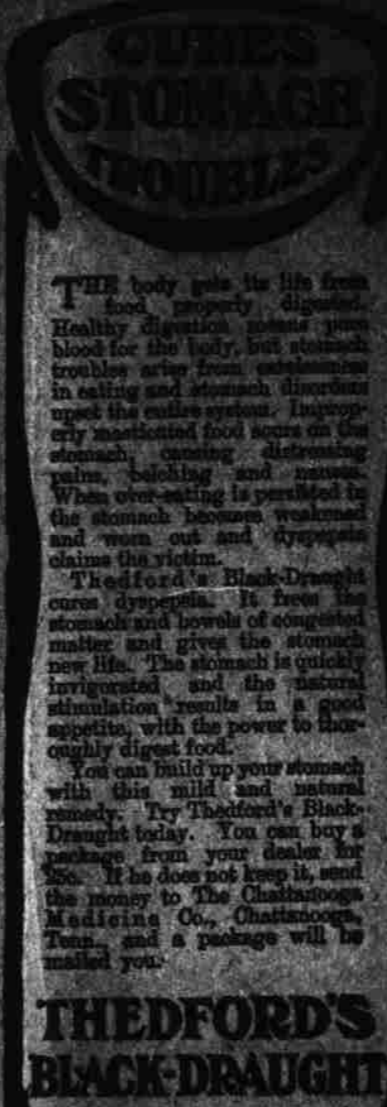

## WON'T PARDON MRS. MAYBRICK.

British Foreign Office Replies That No Further Clemency Can be Granted.

Washington, May 8.—Ambassador Choate has cabled the State Department that the British Foreign Office has refused to grant any further clemency to Mrs. Florence B. Maybrick, who recently made application through the State Department at Washington for a complete pardon.

It appears that Mrs. Maybrick was not granted a complete pardon, but was released from imprisonment on certain conditions, and she still is technically under sentence. Her testimony is regarded as very necessary in the prosecution of a civil action of her mother, the Baroness Von Roques, to recover a sum of money on account of a land transaction which is now pending, and it was to make her eligible as a witness that an application was made to the British government through the State Department to grant a full pardon.

The Baroness Von Roques, plaintiff in a suit against D. W. Armstrong, involving large tracts of land in Virginia and Kentucky, has arrived here from New York, where she landed from Havre. Mrs. Maybrick did not accompany her, being detained in New York by a fractured kneecap, but is expected here Wednesday, when she and the Baroness will go to Richmond to give testimony in the suit. The hearing of evidence for the plaintiff was transferred from this city to Richmond because of questions raised by her counsel as to the admissibility of certain letters, and which he claimed imposed upon her an unnecessary expenditure of money.

## WILL HOLD ROBBERS

Governor Glenn decided Tuesday morning that he will hold the Wadesboro crooks to answer the charge of carrying concealed weapons in Anson county instead of turning them over to the South Carolina authorities, where they are wanted for breaking into the Heath Springs Bank. The Governor's action in holding the men in this State instead of honoring the requisition from South Carolina, is at the suggestion of the Governor of South Carolina made in a letter received today, written in response to a communication from Governor Glenn, laying before the South Carolina Chief Executive the situation.

## SUPERIOR COURT.

Judge Peebles did not hold a session of Guilford Superior Court Wednesday morning on account of the Memorial Day exercises Court convened at 10 o'clock in the afternoon and several judgments were disposed of in a hurry. The grand jury has not yet returned a bill in the case now from Sheriff's responsibility.
