The Queer Way in Which a Number of Indians Celebrated.

A very amusing instance of this is told of the Cheyenne warriors away back in the dark ages, when Cheyenne City was a much smaller place than it is at present.

He and his squaw seated themselves on the box seat and drove off in fine style. Whenever any other Indians of the tribe were encountered on the way they were invited to get aboard, and soon every available inch of space on the roof was filled. Next they were crowded into the box, where they presented a most ludicrous appearance, with their solemn eyes looking through the glass sides. When no more passengers could be admitted the equipage drove off at a fine pace to make a tour of the shops which most appealed to their custom. The occupants of the hearse changed rapidly as the Indians succumbed to their too great purchasing power. The hearse also changed from one owner to another for a small consideration. But through the entire day of the orgie the vehicle was spared any serious damage and at last was sold back to the undertaker for a small sum. His punishment for taking advantage of the simple minded Indian arose from the fact that the citizens of Cheyenne would never consent to hire the hearse again. The remembrance of the part it played in the Indians' spree was too much for them, and thereafter it could have no serious part in their affairs.—New York Herald.

STUDENT A SUICIDE.

Lynchburg, Va., June 2.—Laughton Duiguid, a well known young man of this city, committed suicide at the home of his parents. Last winter he tried to take a two-years course of study in chemistry in a Philadelphia college in one year, but broke down and had to come home. Since then he has been growing worse mentally.

This morning his father, W. D. Duiguid, tried to get him to go to Richmond with him to be treated by a specialist. The young man declined to go and two hours later, while alone, placed the muzzle of a Winchester to his head, pulled the trigger, and died instantly. Deceased was 22 years of age.

COTTON DROPPED \$3 A BALE.

New York, June 2.—The government's first monthly cotton report of the season, giving the average of the stock at 77.2 per cent, and reduction of acreage at 11.4 per cent, was preceded and followed by active selling and excitement on the cotton exchange today. The market was weak from the opening under active pressure, and before the report was issued July sold off to 8.15, October 8.22 and December 8.34. Immediately following the announcement of the government figures, there was great confusion on the cotton exchange due to the New Orleans market, which shot up over 20 points, causing a rally of 6 to 8 points here. This, however, was subsequently lost. It developed later that the average condition was received in New Orleans as 75.2 instead of 77.2. July sold off to 8.10 in the New York market, a decline from last night of about 24 points, and lost one-half a cent from the high point of last Wednesday.

The market closed steady in tone, but at just about the lowest prices, a net decline of 31 to 34 points. Sales were estimated at 750,000 bales.

KEEP OUT, THEY CRY.

Richmond, Va., May 31.—A pamphlet was issued today by John W. Williams & Sons urging stockholders of the Seaboard Air Line to refuse to enter the new holding scheme announced and insisting that the Seaboard already has made arrangements which will provide for its needs amply without re-organization.

It asserts that the Ryan-Blair interests really do not own a majority of the Seaboard, but that they are working to obtain control.
