

Switchmen Join.
WASHINGTON, D. C., July 17.—Special.—President Gompers, announced this morning that the Switchmen's Union of North America with headquarters at Buffalo, had become affiliated with the American Federation of Labor. The union numbers 12,000 members.

Suffers Broken Leg.
Concord, July 17.—A. Jones Yorke, president of the Citizen's Bank, was thrown from his surry this afternoon and suffered a broken leg. He was being driven to the depot on Corbin street near the braid mill when the horse ran down a steep bank. Mr. Yorke was thrown into a ditch and his left leg broken. Both bones above the ankle were fractured.

CENTRAL CAROLINA FAIR.
Will be Formally Opened Tuesday, October 9th in Greensboro.

The premium list of the Central Carolina Fair has been issued and shows a liberal policy toward exhibitors. The premiums are the largest in the history of the fair, and an exhibitor will be required to pay unless they are awarded premiums. The seventh annual Central Carolina Fair will be held in Greensboro Tuesday, October 9th, to Friday, October 12th, inclusive.

The management seeks to encourage the exhibition of only such animals and products as are really meritorious and are of utility and profit to the people of the State. This is the one great object of the Fair and the Society is imbued with an ambition to add a new interest and a new dignity to agricultural and mechanical pursuits and secure increased influence and greater remuneration to those so engaged.

The achievements of the association, the developments of agriculture and its allied industries have never been fully appreciated, even by its best friends; its possibilities for future usefulness in suggesting and disseminating ideas that will materialize in improved crops, live stock and farm practice cannot be over estimated.

In speaking of the track attractions the association make this announcement:

"It is conceded by those capable of judging that we have the finest and fastest track in the State, and seasoned as it now is by the lapse of years it will be better than ever before. The purses are very liberal and this has a wonderful attraction for the best blood of the track. We already have assurance of the presence of some of the veritable gems of the turf will be entered for the races so you may expect exciting races every day of the Fair."

Against a Two-Cent Rate.
Richmond, Va., July 16.—At Stoughton today Judge Henry W. Hof, of the Corporation court handed down an opinion in the case of Virginia vs. the Baltimore and Ohio Railway, declaring the Churchoff two-cent-a-mile rate bill to be in violation of the fourteenth amendment to the Federal Constitution and therefore unconstitutional and void. On this ground he dismissed the suit.

Nebraska Makes Required Speed.
Seattle, Wash., July 18.—The battleship Nebraska was yesterday subjected to the official endurance test, going over the four mile course, which she steamed at the rate of 19.06 knots per hour, exceeding her requirements by .06 knot, and again demonstrating her superiority. In the standardization trip and endurance test the Nebraska was manned by a crew consisting largely of university students and inexperienced seamen.

Walking Around the World.
San Francisco, July 18.—Nicholas George, a Greek and a pedestrian 24 years old, has arrived here from Australia en route to Buda Pest, on a walk around the world.

He must on this pedestrian trip walk thirty thousand miles in three years and three months and at the end of that time get a purse of \$20,000 from the International Tourist Club of Buda Pest. He commenced his trip at Cairo, Egypt, November 17, 1904.

According to his story he walks thirty miles a day and that he has accomplished the different stages is vouched in a diary by "All sorts and conditions of men."

Gen. Stoessel Sentenced.
ST. PETERSBURG, July 19.—Special.—The commission appointed to inquire into the surrender of Port Arthur, filed its report. The commission proposes that General Stoessel, who was in command during the siege be sentenced to death and that General Pack, a member of the staff who urged the surrender be condemned to 20 years' confinement in the galleys.

Whole Town Burning.
ST. PETERSBURG, July 19.—Special.—A telegram received from Samara says the entire town of Syran, containing 2,000 inhabitants in the government of Simbirsk, is afire. The inhabitants are fleeing towards Samara and Saratoff.

Lawyer Discharged.
NEW YORK, July 10.—Special.—Justice Blanchard of the Supreme Court today discharged from custody Burton W. Gibson, a lawyer, held by the coroner Tuesday night at the conclusion of the inquest into the death of Mrs. Alice Kinnan, found murdered on the porch of her residence in the Bronx on the night of June 8. The Assistant District Attorney addressing the jury said that an error had been made and he had no objection to the prisoner being discharged.

Two More Shocks.
FORT WORTH, Tex., July 19.—Two more earthquake shocks were reported from Sorrocco, N. M., extending south of El Paso. A street car was thrown from the track. F. M. Flik, who has just returned from Sorrocco, says: "While I was eating at Winkler Hotel, a shock knocked the plaster from the walls. When I tried to walk it appeared as if the ground was rocky under my feet. Two-thirds of the houses in town are cracked and tumbling down."

Decision Reserved.
NEW YORK, July 19.—Special.—Justice McLean in the Supreme Court today reserved his decision in the motion to make permanent writ of prohibition secured by Thaw's attorney, to restrain the district attorney and the grand jury from taking further evidence in the Thaw case except in the presence of the defendant. There was a long argument and the counsel were given until tomorrow to submit brief. Decision expected next week.

Receivership Hearing.
Durham, July 17.—In Greensboro next Friday there will be heard the facts surrounding the issuing of an order appointing a temporary receiver for the Stone Hosiery Company, of this city. The temporary receiver the Real Estate and Trust Company, was appointed by Judge Shaw on application of W. F. Barbee, one of the stockholders who claims in his affidavit that the company is insolvent. The temporary receiver gave bond in the sum of \$8,000 and Friday it will be decided whether to make permanent or dismiss the receivership. The hosiery mill named has been standing idle since March.
