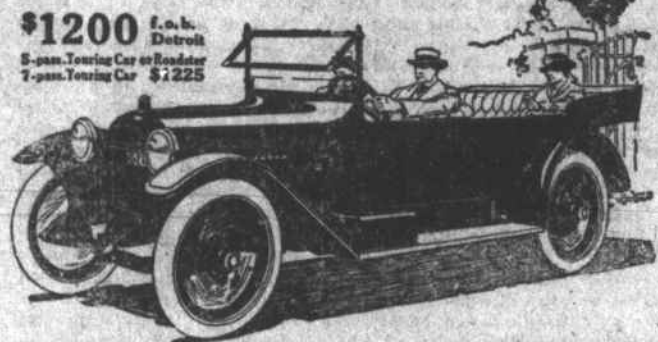

**Recognition Temporarily Withheld**

Why North Carolina Was Not Accepted a Registration State.

Prospects Bright for Future Recognition.

Informal application for recognition as a registration state has been made to the Federal Census authorities by the State Board of Health. A visit has just been made to Washington in behalf of state recognition by Drs. Rankin and Gordon who plead the cause of North Carolina before the census experts. The amended vital statistics law seemed very satisfactory, as did also the birth registration, and for most part, the death registration.

The new director of the Census, Mr. Samuel L. Rogers, himself a North Carolinian, was very anxious that his home State receive recognition. The federal authorities were obliged to point out, however, that while the death registration was satisfactory throughout the greater part of the State and even excellent in a great many counties, on account of the very poor showing made by Duplin, Jackson, Jones, Swain and Watauga counties and the rather poor results obtained in Graham, Rutherford, Stokes, Gates and Currituck counties, that it would be unfair to other states to compare figures from North Carolina.

The hope was extended by the federal authorities, however, that perhaps a little later another investigation might show a marked improvement in the above counties and that the old North State might be accorded proper recognition throughout the civilized world where human beings are held in sufficiently high esteem as to have made official records of their births and deaths.

The State Board of Health is confident that when the facts are appreciated these few counties, for the need of a little more care and attention to the registration of their deaths, will not hinder or impede the progress of the State as a whole.
