Democratic County Con- vention Held at Winton.

Delegates Named to State Convention at Raleigh— Resolutions by B. F. Williams, Offi- cers Endorsed.

The Democrats of Hertford County met in convention to-day pursuant to call of the Chairman, April 22nd 1916. Jno. E. Vann and Jno. A. Northcutt respectively made permanent Chairman and Secretary.

On motion and carried that a committee be appointed to retire and name delegates to the State Convention which convenes in Raleigh on April 27th.

It was moved and carried that a member of the executive Committee from each township be appointed to compose the committee to name said delegates, which committee is as follows: S. P. Winborne, Maney's Neck town-

The Convention thereupon ratified the report of the Committee and the above delegates were appointed to the State Convention.
 Mr. B. F. Williams presented some resolutions looking to abolishing the office of County Treasurer and placing officers on a salary &c., which are as follows:
 "Resolved that it is the sense of this convention that the Clerk of the Court, the Register of Deeds and Sheriff should be placed on a salary, that salary of the Register of Deeds shall be...., the salary of the Clerk of the Court shall be...., the salary of the Sheriff shall be.... and that each of the above officers shall be required to pay over to the treasury weekly

all money collected by them, they shall also be required to make a written sworn statement to the County Commissioners at each of their regular monthly meetings, of the money collected by them since their last report, from whom and for what collected, which reports shall be recorded by the Register of Deeds in a book to be provided by the County, which book shall at all times be open to inspection by any citizen of the County; said report shall also be published in some newspaper published in the County; (the salary is left blank to be determined later, if adopted.)
 "Resolved that it is the sense of this convention that the office of Township Tax Collectors be abolished and that the Sheriff shall have charge of the collecting of all taxes in the County."
 "Resolved that it is the sense of the "one week" courts for Hertford county, be abolished and a Recorders' Court be established with such jurisdiction as is usually given to Recorders Courts; the Clerk of the Superior Court shall act as Clerk to the Recorders Court; that said Court shall be on a fee basis."
 "Resolved that it is the sense of this Convention, that the office of County Treasurer should be abolished and one or more of the banks in the county be authorized to disburse the County funds under proper legal supervision."
 The consideration of these resolutions was postponed for the present and upon motion, it was carried that the Chairman, J. E. Vann call a Mass meeting to be held in Winton not later than the first of September to consider and pass upon the advisability of making these changes.
 The following resolution offered by Mr. W. R. Johnson and unanimously approved, to wit:
 "Resolved that this Convention in Hertford County assembled, point with pride to the administration which President Wilson is giving the country and endorse his public acts."

HON. C. W. MITCHELL WILL OPPOSE CONG. KITCHIN.

(Special Correspondence.)

Windsor, April 22.—Hon. Clingman W. Mitchell, Bertie County's "silver-tongued" orator, announced his candidacy here today for United States Congress to succeed Hon. Claude Kitchin who has represented this district for the past sixteen years. Mr. Mitchell was in this city attending the County Democratic Convention, and the announcement which came as a surprise to many of his friends, was made immediately after the Convention adjourned. The entrance of Mr. Mitchell promises to create one of the most exciting contests of this year's campaign, as Mr. Mitchell is widely known and prominent in financial, industrial and political circles. He stands squarely behind the policies of the Wilson administration, particularly on the questions of national preparedness and our foreign relations, and his friends believe that he will defeat Mr. Kitchin, whose position on these questions, like Bryan's, has produced discord in the official family. However that may be, the chances are that a whirlwind campaign will be waged during the next forty days. Mr. Mitchell is a born orator, a forceful speaker, and a powerful debater. He is a deep student of political economy, and an authority on national affairs. Moreover, he is a man of convictions with the courage to state and uphold them. He is a successful banker, merchant, and farmer, and is connected with the oil mill industry. He has served in the State Legislature as Representative and Senator for several terms and is on the boards of several colleges and state institutions. The contest will be watched with interest throughout the entire State.
