Mr. E, W. Gaither, graduate of A. and E. College of North Carolina, arrived last Friday and has assumed the work as Demonstration Agent for Hertford County. Mr. Gaither is located in the Courthouse building at Winton, and will be in his office every Saturday and the first Monday in each month. He can be reached over phone by calling at the office of County Superintendent of Education, which is located nearby in the same building.

M: Gaither is a native of Davie County, North Carolina, and was reared in Mecklenburg County. He graduated from the State College in 1904. Since that time he has a wide and varied experience in the kink of work which he has undertaken here in Hertford County. He spent six years in experiment work in the State of Ohio, and he comes to this County thoroughly prepared to take care of needs of the farmer and stockraiser.




