John Adams, Washington, Vice-President, died in the White House, Jefferson, Adams's Vice-President, died likewise, and Martin Van Buren, one of Jackson's Vice-Presidents, was his successor. The other four became President by death. They were Tyler, Fillmore, Johnson and Arthur.
