THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE.

We lay before our readers to-day the able message of the President of the United States communicated to Congress yesterday.

We regret that he does not include in his recommendation either a repeal or modification of the internal revenue laws.

How Congress can avoid heeding the counsel of the President upon the matter of tariff reduction we cannot see; and should it do so, we believe the people will hold the delinquent members thereof to a fearful responsibility.

It is a sound, irresistible paper, and must produce a strong effect upon Congress and the country.

"Honesty, frankness and fair play are essential to journalism as the best policy in the end, fearless truth-telling and faithful warning must prevail against demagogic and slavish tickling of the public ear."
