It is as important to study this business as any other, and it will pay him best who gives close and constant attention to its conditions.

It is not generally known that there exists on the proposed line of the Durham, Oxford and Blue Wing railroad one of the richest veins of copper ore in this country. C. R. Sapper, of Pennsylvania, has recently purchased what is known as the "Old Royster mines" situated in Northern Granville, near Blue Wing. He has made an assay of the ore which ran 48 per cent copper. This is unusually rich as the best ore known only runs 56 per cent. Mr. Sapper, who represents large capitalists, has formed a stock company with a capital of \$500,000, for the purpose of working the mines. A steam hoister and reduction works are to be erected at once, and the plant will be in full blast by the time the railroad is in running order.
