MANSLAUGHTER.
Myra Conley convicted of Manslaughter Yesterday.

Yesterday morning when they came into court at 9:50 o'clock, and asked his Honor for a clearer explanation of the difference between murder and manslaughter, the large assemblage that filled the courtroom knew that the conflict between the jurors in the case was confined to this difference between them.

And when the foreman of the jury asked Judge MacRae if they failed to make up a verdict of murder, could they bring in a verdict of manslaughter, Col. Jones stepped over to the prisoner, and whispering in her ear, probably told her she need not hope for acquittal.

The jury then retired and after ten minutes to three o'clock p. m. came into court and announced that they had made up their verdict—and that their verdict was that the prisoner at the bar was guilty of manslaughter. The prisoner did not seem to be agitated in the least at the announcement, and her counsel asked his Honor not to sentence her until the arrival of the motions, which they proposed entering in the case. The State not praying judgment, his honor acquiesced in the prayer of counsel for the defence, and the prisoner will not be sentenced until one day next week.

The jury was discharged, prisoner remained to jail and court was adjourned for the week.
