Mr. Chas. Price, of Salisbury, is in the city. Many even bets on Cleveland's carrying New York, were made on the streets yesterday. The city was well policed last night, a number of special officers being sworn in to preserve the peace. Mitchell county is reported to have given Ewart 450 majority, and the republican county ticket in Transylvania has been elected.

Mr. Geo. C. Bason, assistant U. S. District Attorney, and Mr. A. E. Posey, attorney at law, from Hendersonville, are among the arrivals in the city. It is Mr. Samuel Stradley, and not Rev. Thomas Stradley, whose death and funeral were noticed yesterday. The error was not ours. It was an informant, himself mistaken, who misinformed us.

The Carolina Athletic club rooms were filled with people last night who were eager to hear the news from the elections. A special bulletin was run into the building, and bulletins were regularly received. All the saloons in the city were closed yesterday afternoon, owing to the excitement caused by the report of election news from the North. Several disturbances occurred on the street, but no general outbreak took place. Mr. Walter E. Moore, of Webster, came in last night. He reports Johnston's majority in Jackson as being about 350. The State and National democratic tickets are elected, and Dills, independent, is elected to the house.

The indications are that the State has gone democratic by a handsome majority. All our nominees for State offices, for the Supreme Court bench and for Presidential electors are elected and the threatening shadow of radicalism has passed from over North Carolina. The outrageous methods of Eaves and his cohorts have aroused the indignation of true Tar Heels in a way that has rarely if ever before been equalled in the history of the State and the people have in consequence arisen in their might and elected the whole democratic ticket with a whirl. The outlook as we write is most gratifying. Fowle is to be our next Governor. This is a glory enough for one day, but there is more glory still for Democrats elsewhere. Read of it.—News Observer.

It has always been the fate of our party to receive its worst news first. It happened at the last presidential election. The first telegrams are cooked to suit certain purposes, and others delayed for certain other purposes. The republicans make the most comprehensive claims in their usual spirit of boastfulness. If New York was really voted for Harrison we would have known it authentically by this time. So with Indiana. Tuesday night, the republicans boldly claimed a majority in both these States. Last night they admitted a doubt in Indiana, and the bulletins made a concession that a count could only determine the position in New York.

In doubt there is hope, almost more than hope; it amounts almost to certainty that both these States have voted for Cleveland.
